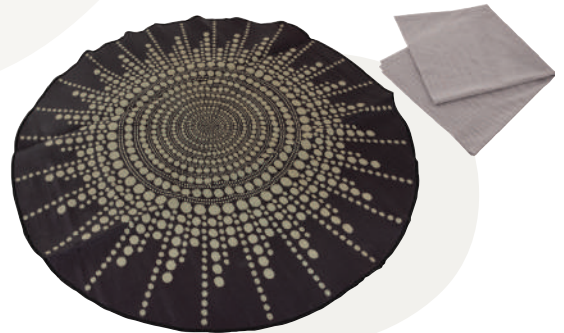
From a young age, Leanne Watson Redpath was inspired to tell stories through painting. Taught by her mother, Aunty Edna Watson and brother, Bundeluk Watson, Leanne is now an award-winning artist and illustrator.

As a proud Dharug woman, Leanne always tells a story through her art. 'The stories that I include are from my country and connected to it.'

Leanne explains, 'Dharug stories relate to our cultural practices. Our art is a part of our culture and tells our stories. I've been taught that we always need stories to pass on and to help share our beautiful culture.'

Leanne's art features in MTA resources such as puzzles, games, dress-ups, cushions, pillows, floor mats, stepping stones, magazine boxes and the award-winning Indigenous Discovery Big Books and Picture Book Bilingual Pack, with a special audio recording in Dharug you unlock with a QR code in each book.

Known in the Aboriginal community as 'Mulgo' meaning Black Swan, Leanne also works alongside a range of Aboriginal groups and consultants specialising in Aboriginal site awareness, education and protection. But at heart, the Black Swan is a storyteller.

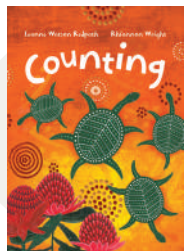

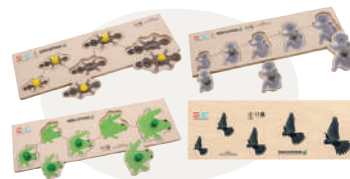

Traditional culture, popular culture & some tropical magic

The lush Daintree Rainforest and Mossman Gorge are some of the tropical surroundings that infuse the rich colours in the work of award-winning artist, Luke Mallie.

Luke is of both Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent, with ties to the Kuku Yalanji Nation in the Daintree/Mossman area and Kubin Village on Moa Island in the Torres Strait Islands.

Luke has earned a reputation as one of Australia's best Indigenous artists and designers for his amazing artwork, which is inspired by his family, his culture, tropical surroundings and by more modern themes too (architecture, fashion and advertising).

This rich combination of influences is shown in the wide range of MTA resources Luke has created... from Dreamtime journey table linens and Spirit of Australia foam-filled loungers to Aboriginal art hand-cut wooden dominoes, stained glass rainbow serpents, Indigenous stamps, sand art boomerangs and shrink film animals.

There is vivid colour, energy and pride in Luke's artwork that makes it so distinctive. He enjoys working in a broad range of mediums and through his MTA collaboration, he hopes he can inspire educators and children to discover something amazing in their own lives and perform to their own full potential.

Sharing Indigenous cultural knowledge through art

The name Billyara comes from this award-winning Indigenous artist's totem, an eagle. With 35 years flying high as an artist, we sat down with Billyara for five fast questions.

What is the inspiration behind your work?

I draw inspiration from the landscape, animals and practices of Indigenous peoples. The colours that feature pop throughout my work as I create themes from coast to bush.

How do you incorporate your cultural heritage into your pieces?

I depict Indigenous cultural knowledge that many tribes and peoples share.

How does your storytelling relate to traditional Indigenous practices?

Indigenous peoples' knowledge has always been shared through storytelling, songs and art. Using knowledge passed down to me, I translate it into a visual piece of art.

How do you balance traditional techniques with contemporary practices?

With modern mediums, the same traditional storytelling goal is there, however techniques can be refined as products improve, making application of layers easier to control.

How does your work play a role in the educational space?

I like to incorporate an educational theme into my artwork, and by having it printed onto cushions, mats or puzzles, it can be incorporated in any setting.

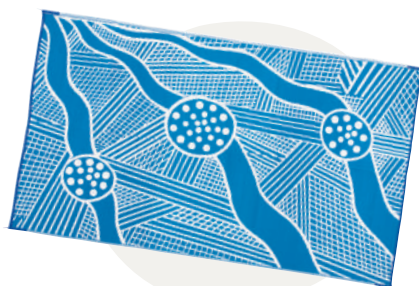

Turning passion for Indigenous perspectives into beautiful resources

As a mum of primary school aged children and a proud Dunghutti woman, Debbie Hoyer of Riley Callie Resources wanted to play her part in creating an educational environment where children can grow up in a world that not only includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives but celebrates First Nations cultures.

Riley Callie's product range features Indigenous educational flashcards that include Aboriginal Topic Cards, Bush Food Snap and Aboriginal Tools Memory Cards. Storytelling is central to how these cards can be used in the classroom, with each set designed to tell a story about Aboriginal culture, history and knowledge.

'We developed these resources with teachers in mind. We put thought into how we could best present information and knowledge about Aboriginal culture, in an easy-to-use format that children can pick up and learn from, and teachers can feel confident using in their classrooms', Debbie continues.

The goal of Riley Callie Resources is to spark interest in children learning more about Aboriginal culture. Debbie adds, 'We also want to contribute towards truth-telling in the classroom, so that children can be equipped with the knowledge to form an inclusive understanding of Aboriginal people, communities and culture'.

From ancient spiritual symbols to mixed medium contemporary art

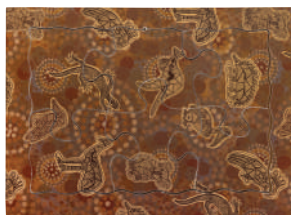
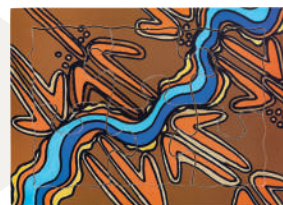
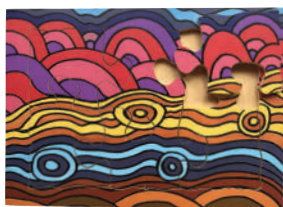
A force of nature, multi-award winning artist John Smith Gumbula is a proud descendant of the Wakka Wakka/Gurang Gurang people. For more than three decades, he has been passionately involved in the arts, creative expression and cultural activities of his people.

‘When I was young, I spent 6 months in a plaster cast and 12 months on my back and in a wheelchair. I was given a box of pencils and a drawing pad and that was where it all began.’

Using rich earthy tones and vibrant colours, Gumbula’s art portrays spiritually significant symbols, motifs and images of flora and fauna. ‘The native animals of Australia have had an important ancient spiritual connection to our people and country for over 60,000 years’, Gumbula adds.

MTA resources that feature the artwork of Gumbula include Billabong Dreaming cushions and floor mats, Aboriginal art puzzles, land and marine animal cushions and Billabong Sacred Place outdoor cushions.

‘As a Wakka Wakka man, I am proud of my Aboriginal heritage and diverse creative Indigenous professional achievements over many years. My contemporary Aboriginal art resonates deep in my heart, soul and spirit, connecting me physically and spiritually to country.’

Promoting cultural awareness and education through art

Bayadherra is a group of emerging artists to watch! With a mission to promote reconciliation, cultural awareness and understanding by reflecting their First Nations heritage in authentic contemporary art pieces, Bayadherra is 100% Aboriginal-owned and operated – and making a stunning impact.

The group is founded by proud Yorta Yorta brother and sister Luke and Siena Tieri, descendants of the James Family from Shepparton, Victoria. Their grandfather Glenn James OAM is recognised as the first Indigenous man to umpire Australian rules football in the AFL!

‘In Yorta Yorta language, Bayadherra means turtle, the spiritual animal totem of the Yorta Yorta clan’, Luke and Siena explain. The name reflects their Aboriginal identity and connection to community and Country.

MTA collaborated with Bayadherra to create a beautiful Creatistics art smock featuring one of Luke and Siena’s art pieces entitled Dungala Woka (‘River land’). ‘The Dungala is the heart of the Yorta Yorta Nation and symbolises our connection to Country, culture and community’. With MTA educators, it’s already a crowd pleaser with its gorgeous colours, design and meaning.

Through their art, Bayadherra hope to promote cultural awareness and convey an important message. ‘We must care for Country and Country will care for us.’

Born in Mackay, Queensland, Charlie Wicking is an amazing artist who has been painting for around 25 years now. She also works in early childhood education so knows the power of inspiration through nature and art.

'The Traditional Custodians of the land here and surrounding districts are the Yuibera, Barada Barna and Widi Tribes. I am a descendant of Aboriginal and South Sea Islander people of this area, and my South Sea Islander family came from the Solomon Islands and Vanuatu', Charlie explains.

Living in a coastal area, Charlie is inspired daily by her natural environment, particularly the sea. This local inspiration is reflected in her artworks with her colourful and vibrant style.

'I value my ancestral past and acknowledge my descendants proudly. I love the area I live in, the wonder of the rainforests, the beauty of the sea, the harshness of the earth, when nature is at its hottest. It provides me with a muse that I can't get enough of'.

Charlie is passionate about protecting the land and sea where we live and play. 'Once it's gone, it's gone. If we protect country, country will protect and provide for us.'

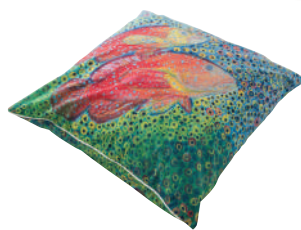
