Description of necessary first aid measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

For non-emergency personnel

Methods and materials for containment and clean up

Large spills – If safe, stop leak and contain spill, preventing it from entering drains or water courses. Absorb using sand, vermiculite or other absorbent material. If spill is large or if absorbent is not available create a dam to stop the spread. Collect product and place into clearly labelled containers for disposal in accordance with local regulations. Prevent wash up from entering drains. If a significant quantity enters drains, advise emergency services. Small spills – Do not normally need any special clean up measures. Never return spills to original container for re-use.
